## 'Museums Together'

### A Collaborative Islamic & Jewish Interfaith Schools Program

**Jenny Better – Senior Education Coordinator, Jewish Museum of Australia**



**Jenny Better** is the Senior education Coordinator at the Jewish Museum of Australia where she manages the Schools education program including the educational method and content and the large team of volunteers that deliver the programs to students of all different faith backgrounds. It is in this role that she has organised and coordinated many harmony days programs and it was because of this work in 2009 that she was awarded a Victorian Multicultural Award for educational excellence.

More recently Jenny has managed a program called 'Museums Together' where the Islamic Museum of Australia and the Jewish Museum of Australia collaborated to upskill the year 6 students from an Islamic school and a Jewish School enabling the students to take their cohort from a different faith group around their Museums

Jenny was born in the UK and emigrated to Australia in the 1960s when she was a child. Her adult work life has been dedicated to teaching including her role as a teacher at Our Lady of Mercy College. Jenny is married to Nathan Better and they are the proud parents of 4 adult children.
