The Intercultural Understanding Partnership (ICUP) is a national initiative created by <u>Together</u> For Humanity (TFH) and funded by the Australian Government.

ICUP provides opportunities for you to work closely with TFH and its partners, the <u>Jewish Christian</u>

<u>Muslim Association (JCMA)</u> in Victoria and <u>The Abraham Institute</u> in South Australia, to address a cross-cultural challenge in your school community.

If your ICUP application is successful, you will receive up to \$10,000 to address your challenge and improve the learning and wellbeing of your students. You will also have the opportunity to work collaboratively with an experienced ICUP facilitator, located in your state or territory, throughout your project.

## The first ICUP Grants were offered in 2020-21

- 35 schools
- 5 states
- 27 projects

>\$179,000 to address cross-cultural challenges

Participating schools included small and large, public and private, primary and secondary schools in metropolitan and regional areas.

**Projects addressed** a range of issues including:

increased incidents of racism as a result of COVID

challenges in schools with a high number of refugee enrolments

providing regional students with an understanding of, and connection to, people from different cultures

 facilitating greater belonging for Indigenous students and more
